Our Certificate of Non-inclusion for Chemicals Listed in Annex A
to the Stockholm Convention on Persistent Organic Pollutants (POPs)

This is to reply to your inquiry about our Certificate of Non-inclusion for chemicals listed in Annex A to the Stockholm Convention (known as “POPs Treaty”), as chemicals to be eliminated (hereinafter, “Listed Chemicals”).

Based on our management criteria for regulated chemicals, we demonstrate non-use of specific chemicals that are typically required by electrical and electronics industry as identified in the attached document, “*Certificate of Non-inclusion for Prohibited Substances in Products*”, in which some Listed Chemicals are included.

If Annex A is updated to include new chemicals, we will determine whether such additional chemicals need to be covered by our Certificate of Non-inclusion, taking into consideration of regulatory responses by other countries, as well as uses of such chemicals.
